Note !!!! No Make-Up Scores Allowed – All scores are due to the scorekeeper on Mondays.

- 1. TYPE OF LEAGUE:** This will be a one-division, any sight, handicap league. There will be no limit to the number of shooters on a team. At this time the high four handicap scores are to count for the team total. The number of team members will be re-addressed each year prior to the beginning of the season.
- 2. COURSE OF FIRE:** Ten shots each in Prone, Kneeling and Standing. The positions may be fired in any order. Shooter may opt to shoot the next more difficult position for prone and/or kneeling (eg. Kneeling or Standing instead of Prone and Standing instead of Kneeling).
- 3. TIME LIMIT:** The allotted time will be 36 Minutes including all sighting shots, and all position changes.
- 4. TARGETS:** 11-bull (A-17) must be used.
- 5. NUMBERING OF TARGETS:** No numbers, marks, or identifying features will be allowed on the front of the targets except for one indicating the position for which it is intended. All targets will have a number on the back for identification purposes. If the target is used in a postal match it must be so indicated on the back. Violation of this rule will result in the illegally marked targets being disqualified from counting toward any match during the season. However, the targets will be scored and the score will be counted for the shooters scratch score.
- 6. RELAY SIGN-UP SHEETS:** Relay sign-up sheets will be provided for each match. Competitors **MUST** sign up and shoot according to these sheets. Shooting times vary from range to range according to range operating rules.
- 7. MATCH RESULTS:** Team Captains are responsible for posting match results on the range bulletin board each week.

8. **WITNESSED SCORES:** A target that is fired and scored in the presence of an opposing team or RSO.

9. **POSTPONED MATCHES:** In the event a team finds it cannot fire a regularly scheduled match, the Team Captain must notify the opposing Team Captain at least 24 hours in advance. Matches may be postponed if the range is not available or by mutual agreement. If a four-man team does not show up on a scheduled night and has failed to notify the opposing team, the team that shows up may fire for record. Postponed matches will be made up prior to the last regularly scheduled match unless both teams agree not to fire the match. In which case the teams involved will be awarded one-half point in the won and loss column.
10. **TEAM SCORE TIED:** The NRA Smallbore Rules (2010 edition) will be used to break all ties.
11. **NEW SHOOTER:** *A new shooter is one who has not fired in this League during the past season or had four or less fired scores from the last season. New shooters will receive a handicap after firing one match, and they will be eligible for a handicap thereafter.* Team Captains will provide the Stat Officer with the new shooter's name, address, zip code, phone number as soon as possible after they begin to participate in the league.
12. **MATCH FEES:** There is a \$50.00 league fee per competitor. All fees must be paid by the 3rd week of competition. (Juniors \$30.00)
13. **AWARDS:**
Team Awards - There will be awards for the winning team (*determined by handicap scores each week*).
Individual Awards - Individual awards will be based on scratch scores. At this time, at least 8-matches must be fired to be eligible for individual awards. This number will be re-addressed at the beginning of each season.

- 14. COMPUTING A HANDICAP AVERAGE:** Handicaps will be determined as follows: $.8 * (300 - \text{AVG})$. Handicaps will be rounded up to the nearest tenth ($33.45 = 33.5$ $33.449 = 33.4$). **The shooter's initial AVG will be last year's average. AVG will be the average of matches fired and last year's average. After 4 scores, the lowest score will be dropped (for purposes of determining handicap). The lowest score will also be dropped after 8 scores. The maximum handicap is 60 points.**
- 15. CLASSIFICATIONS:** Master – 98% and up; Expert – 96.5% to 97.99%; Sharpshooter – 93% to 96.49%; Marksman – 92.99% and below. You will not be lowered in class until your average for the past two years drops you into a lower class. You will be advanced in class based on your performance of the previous year. However, you must shoot at least 5 scores. Otherwise, you'll revert to an unclassified shooter for the next season. **Due to the number of competitors Classifications will not be used.**
- 16. X-COUNT:** In this League, an "X" is defined as a ten that does not touch the inside of the nine ring.
- 17. SUPPORTED RIFLES:** Supported rifles are permitted for shooters age 65 and up only.
